# Amy Brandt Editor in Chief, Pointe Magazine

A native of Libertyville, Illinois, Amy has been the editor in chief of Pointe since 2014. She danced professionally with the Milwaukee Ballet and The Suzanne Farrell Ballet, among others, performing a large repertoire that included 19th century classics and works by George Balanchine, Antony Tudor, Jerome Robbins and Alonzo King. Amy also performed in honor of Ms. Farrell at the 2005 Kennedy Center Honors. In 2009, she began writing Pointe's "Ask Amy" advice column. Amy graduated summa cum laude from Marymount Manhattan College with a BA in English and World Literatures in 2014, and she has served on the department's advisory board. She is also senior consulting editor for Dance Teacher.



Susan Bryant Houston Ballet, Academy Faculty

Susan Bryant began her dancing career studying with Muriel Evans and Lisa Shaw in Hampton, Virginia. She continued her training at North Carolina School of the Arts and after graduation joined Houston Ballet's Ben Stevenson Academy.

One year later Ms. Bryant was invited to join the company as a member of the Corps de Ballet. She attained the rank of Soloist and enjoyed a 20 year career dancing with Houston Ballet under the direction of both Ben

Stevenson and current Artistic Director Stanton Welch. Ms. Bryant enjoyed featured roles in BenStevenson's Swan Lake, The Sleeping Beauty, Don Quixote, Dracula, Coppelia, Peer Gynt, Romeo and Juliet, Snow Maiden, Four Last Songs and Five Poems. She had featured roles in Sir Fredrick Ashton's Les Patineurs, Sir Kenneth MacMillian's Elite Syncopations and Manon. Her contemporary roles included dancing in the world premiere of Paul Taylor's Company B at the Kennedy Center, Christopher Bruce's Cruel Garden, Glen Tetley's Daphnis and Chloe, The Rite of Spring, and Lux in Tenebris, Jiri Kylian's Sinfonietta and Symphony in D. Ms. Bryant also enjoyed roles in George Balanchine's La Valse, The Four Temperments, Agon, Serenade, and Symphony in C and Stanton Welch's Bruiser, Madame Butterfly, and Bolero.



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Upon her retirement in 2005, Ms. Bryant was invited by Artistic Director Stanton Welch to portray the role of the Queen in the world premiere of his new Swan Lake. She was also invited to teach in the Houston Ballet Ben Stevenson Academy where she continues to teach in the Upper School and in the Adult Open Class Program.



Michelle Martin
Ballet Austin, Associate Artistic Director

Michelle Martin had her early dance training at the Alberta Ballet School and danced with the Alberta Ballet Company for four years before joining the Indianapolis Ballet Theatre (IBT) in 1982. While with IBT and, subsequently, the Hartford Ballet in Connecticut, she performed leading and soloist roles in *Romeo and Juliet*, *The Nutcracker*, *The Sleeping Beauty* and *The Moor's Pavane* as well as creating roles in many original works.

Martin's teaching credits include guest-teaching engagements at schools and universities in Canada, South Carolina, Michigan, and throughout

Indiana and Texas. She was on faculty at Butler University in Indianapolis for five years. Martin began her tenure with Ballet Austin in 1991 as a dancer with the Company and in 1992 she was appointed ballet mistress and curriculum director of the Academy.

In 1999 she founded Ballet Austin II, Ballet Austin's apprentice program, providing professional development for the 10-member second company and designing educational programming for presentation in schools. Martin has served on the Texas Commission on the Arts advisory panel for Arts Education and is a recipient of the Austin Under Forty award for contributions in the area of the Arts and Entertainment. Martin was appointed associate artistic director of Ballet Austin in 2000.



Allison Miller
Houston Ballet Faculty

Originally from St. Petersburg, Florida, Allison Miller recently retired from a 16-year career with the Houston Ballet. She studied with Diane Partington before attending North Carolina School of the Arts (UNCSA). She joined the American Ballet Theatre Studio Company in 2004 and Houston Ballet in 2006, rising to the rank of First Soloist. She danced soloist and leading roles in many ballets, including Ballo della Regina (Balanchine), Serenade (Balanchine), La Sylphide (Bournonville), Kitri in Don Quixote, Swanhilda in Coppelia, as well as Clara and The Sugar Plum Fairy in The Nutcracker. Allison is excited to pass on what she has learned to the next generation of dancers through teaching and coaching. She is currently on faculty at Houston Ballet Academy.
